RISK	Action/ Method in order to mitigate risk	Compliance & Communication
Cross infection	No client or trainer should attend training if they or a member of their household are showing covid symptoms, are self isolating, or they or a household member are awaiting PCR test results.	All clients advised by email
Failure to adhere to guidance on group numbers/size prior to 12th April 2021	Sessions to be split to 1 trainer and 3 clients	PS and JA to supervise on arrival
Failure to adhere to guidance on group size from 12th April	Groups to be kept small with no spectators or multiple client handlers	Clients advised by email. PS and JA to ensure compliance
Arriving for training may increase risk of clients mingling if they all get out of their cars simultaneously	Clients to park and stay in cars until trainers arrive.	
Transfer to training site may increase the contact risk	Clients and trainers to wear masks/face coverings from cars to field and through gateways	
Clients may expect to use internal hand washing facilities which would increase the risk of cross infection	Clients required to bring hand sanitiser to use before, during and after training. No access to indoor spaces or lavatories	Clients advised by email. PS and JA to check all clients have sanitiser at the beginning of each session. PS and JA to have spare sanitiser, masks and disposable gloves available to ensure compliance

<b>During Training:</b>		
Transmission of infection due to close contact	Clients and trainers to maintain a 2 metre distance	Clients advised by email. PS and JA to ensure compliance
Transmission of infection with shared equipment	Clients to bring own leads, collar, whistle, training line, training treats, toys, dummies, poo bags to avoid any sharing of equipment	All clients advised by email. PS and JA to have standby supply of new or disinfected equipment available if needed
Transmision of infection by cross-handling dogs	Clients are not to handle other dogs or leads	All clients advised by email.

Trainers may be required to handle dogs increasing the risk of cross infection	Minimise cross handling where possible. To mitigate risk where handling by the trainer is necessary, both client and trainer to wear masks/face coverings and to use hand sanitiser or disposable gloves	All clients advised by email. PS and JA to have standby supply of masks, gloves, sanitiser
Gun dog sessions require the use of training equipment increasing potential risk of cross infection	Gun dog clients to bring their own dummies and equipment to use where possible	Advised by email
WDT dummies provided for clients use with potential risk of cross infection	To mitigate the risk of using WDT dummies and cross handling, all WDT dummies will be disinfected before and after use, or not used for a minimum of 72 hours. Milton steriliser will be used.	PS and JA to ensure a clean supply of all necessary equipment
WDT training lines, toys, balls etc with potential risk of cross infection	To avoid use if client has their own equipment. WDT will have a supply of clean equipment to use when necessary.	PS and JA to ensure a clean supply of all necessary equipment
Transfer from training site to clients cars may increase the contact risk	Clients and trainers to wear masks/face coverings from field to cars. To minimise 'chatting' around cars and maintain two metre distance	PS and JA to ensure compliance
Risk that clients are unaware of the risk assessment and do not adhere to the requirements	Communicate by email to all clients and by website. Trainers to be vigilant ensuring any new clients receive the risk assessment. To remind clients during training sessions of the need to adhere to the requirements.	PS and JA To ensure effective communication to all clients of the risk assessment requirements
